

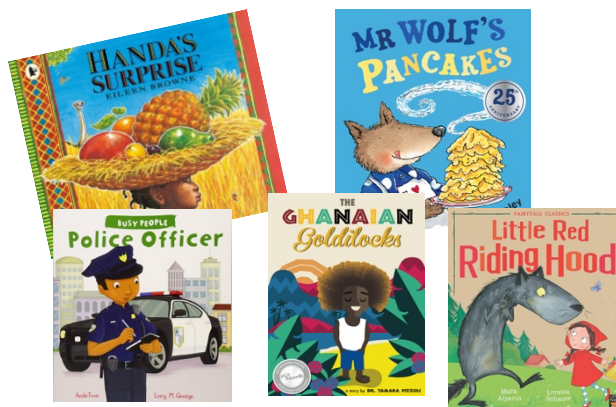

WE ARE READING...



Reading & Writing

We will continue to use Read, Write, Inc. to develop our reading and writing skills. Children will learn new letters and sounds each week and will receive a sounds book to recap sounds they have learnt, at home.

Please read with your child to help them become a fluent reader, earn dojo points and reading stars in school.

In writing, children will take part in Drawing Club. Drawing Club allows children to write at the cusp of their confidence whilst also encouraging children to use their imagination and think of their own ideas, based on a story, tale or TV programme from the past.

Maths

We are mastering the numbers 0 to 10 this term. We will continue to learn how to count accurately, subitise and learn the composition of each number.

We will also learn about and compare lengths and heights.
