
Read chapter 4, 5 and 6. This chapter focuses on the friendship between Bert and Daisy.

Make a card for either your best friend, mum or dad. Tell them what it is about them that you think is special & draw a picture you think they will like.


You might want to ask your parents to try and get the address of your best friend or go for a walk and post their card through the letterbox.


Wednesday



