

We sometimes don't take the time to notice all of the beautiful things that we have around us in nature. Try making a sky scanner to see things around you very closely.

To make a sky scanner all you need to do is cut a hole in the centre of a piece of paper, decorate this and point it at things around you. **Make sure you don't look directly at the sun.** You can look through the hole and see what catches your attention. This gives you the opportunity to focus on things in a more detail. You can then talk about the things you have seen or even research them. E.g. What kind of birds did you spot? Why do the clouds move? What has happened to the trees now the month of June is here?

You can also have a go at making your very own binoculars to see what is around you. **Again, make sure you don't look at the sun through these.**

You will need: some paper, pencils or pens and some scissors for you sky scanner. For the binoculars you will need 2 kitchen roll inners and tape.



Step 1. Put your 2 kitchen roll inners together.



Step 2. Tape the rolls together at both ends making sure the tape goes all the way around so they don't slip around.
